## News from the Chapter Director

With riding season just around the corner, it is time to make sure our bikes are in tiptop shape for the rides to come. By this – I mean checking the radiator fluid – it might need to be flushed out. Brakes – check the pads, fluids and brake lines. Batteries – check the water level and battery connections. Front fork seals for leaks. These are a few of the things that you could check every so often

The things that should be checked every time you get on your bike to ride are the tires, oil and lights. This is a good habit to get into before taking a ride. Your motorcycle is only as good as the maintenance you do on it. We usually have a maintenance day twice a year, once before the Louisiana District Rally in the spring and once before the Mississippi Rally in the fall. Jim and Lynn Flournoy are always gracious to let us use their huge garage for the gathering.

I know first hand how important it is to check everything out before you leave on a ride. I left on a ride and checked the air pressure and the tires but failed to check the valve stems, I had just had new tires put on my bike and was ready to ride. About two hundred miles into the ride, my bike got a little wobbly at low speeds. I was pulling a trailer, which made it a little more difficult; I pulled the bike over and found that the front tire was low. My buddy had an air compressor so we aired up the tire but it was going down as fast as put the air in the tire. With my mechanical abilities I performed an emergency quick fix by putting a zip tie around the stem to hold it in position where it was not leaking. A few miles later there was a Honda dealership and I had the tire repaired. A two-dollar part almost ruined a nice road trip. Now I check the valve stem when I check the air pressure in the tires. It was also a good lesson to me, to have the valve stems replaced every time you buy new tires. Lets all get into those good habits so we can enjoy the nice riding weather.

Lets put on our thinking caps and come up with some good rides this year. I know we have some rallies coming up but we need some input from our members on rides they would like to go on. We have some members that give us ideas all the time like the ride to Brenham Airport for lunch, mystery ride, The Tree in Woodville, Florida's in Livingston and Mel's Diner in Tomball. These were great rides. We also have some upcoming rides and events that were suggested by chapter members – a Wii party and ice cream social, Bay Area ride to the Space Center, D'Rose Inn in Leakey, T. We also have a picnic ride to Mission Tejas State Park that someone suggested last year and a progressive ride that sounds like fun.

Lets check out those bikes and get ready to do some safe riding.

## Rider Education

### *Rider and Co-Rider Fatigue*

*'Tis the Season again. No, not that season, 'tis Rally Season. Are you making plans on which rallies you plan to attend? The choices are plentiful and you may be planning to attend all of them. Some riders in our Chapter have already had their first route planning session for Wing Ding in South Carolina.*

As you make your plans concerning which rallies, which routes, which side trips, and which tourist stops to make prepare one more plan. Make a plan to overcome fatigue. Failing to prepare for this event can have serious outcomes. Every year, after Wing Ding, we hear about several serious or fatal accidents. It is a good bet that fatigue played a big part in these accidents. Rider Fatigue is a real problem and can catch even the best of riders off guard. So make your plans to recognize and deal with this issue before you even pull out of the driveway. To help understand what fatigue is I have a definition from the NHSTB.

*“Fatigue is the body’s response to continued physical activity, mental activity, or sleep loss, and is characterized by:*

- *A diminished ability to drive,*
  - *A loss of attention*
  - *Slower reactions*
  - *Poor responses*
  - *Deterioration of vigilance and alertness*
  - *Impaired judgment*
- Subjective feelings of tiredness, loss of motivation, and a desire for rest*

As you can see fatigue is a serious safety issue. Fatigue is not a new problem; all of us have had to deal with this at times. But, to be safer on the road, we need to recognize fatigue and deal with it immediately. There are many causes and contributors to fatigue.

Some common causes for fatigue are fairly easy to recognize and understand:

- *Inadequate Rest*
- *Sleep loss or disruption*
- *Displaced biological rhythms*
- *Excessive physical activity*
- *Excessive mental or cognitive work*

The contributors to fatigue include:

- *Poor road conditions*
- *Dawn driving*
- *Poor weather*

So, can you see how these factors would come into play on those long, hard runs to the various Rallies?

It is very likely that you would start your trip a little tired. Speaking for myself, the night before departure usually involves last minute maintenance, and packing the trailer. Checking and re-checking a multitude of minute details such as maps, routes, credit cards, confirmation numbers, itineraries, and etc. All necessary, but contributing to fatigue. Then, I am usually too excited about the trip to get good nights sleep during the last night in my bed for a while.

Now think about all those other contributors. You get up very early, breaking your normal routine, which upsets your *Biological Rhythms*.

You leave early and ride hard for the day. Is your body used to that much *Excessive Physical and Mental activity*.

**You may be driving on unfamiliar roads, which will increase the stress. Add poor roads and/or bad weather and the mental overload can become very real. So, now that we have identified the problem, let's talk about some ways to overcome this issue. These solutions are all straightforward common sense things we do daily at home. But, riding in a group and on a schedule we tend to forget our common sense at times.**

- *Get the best rest you can before starting the trip*
- *Get as much sleep as you can each day*
- *Get your sleep at your normal times if possible*
- *Don't forget physical fitness and proper nutrition*
- *Sleep in a darkened room as much as possible*
- *Keep the room temperature comfortable*
- *Stretch your muscles during rest stops*
- *And remember-if you feel sleepy then you are sleepy*

These are all simple fixes in a complicated situation. Riders are breaking their normal routines. Some are riding more miles in a day than they usually do in a month. Some have trouble sleeping in strange beds. Some are just so excited to be out on the road they try to fit too much activity into one day. At the end of the day allow your body the sleep and rest it needs to enjoy the next day's adventure. You will enjoy your trip much more and will get home safely with a camera and a mind full of wonderful memories. So, get out there and ride to the Rally's and remember *'Tis the Season*. And we will see you when you get back.

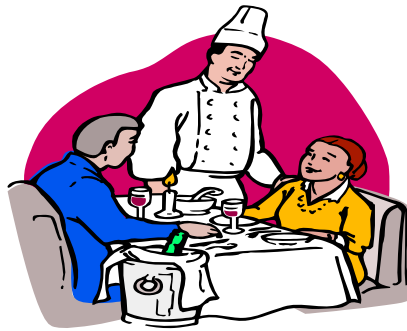


