Rider Education

Road Reflexes

A reflex is an automatic or involuntary reaction to a stimulus. Driving often calls for you to respond to a situation, which demands some kind of action (reaction).

For example, you are driving along, and the brake lights of the vehicle ahead suddenly come on. Your eyes see those brake lights and send the message to your brain. Your brain decides what, if any, action needs to be taken. Finally, another part of your brain gets the message and passes it on to whatever part of the body needs to perform this action. In this case our hands and feet get the message. The hands roll off the throttle and covers the clutch lever and brake lever. Your right foot covers or depresses the brake lever while your left foot prepares to change gears as needed.

This whole reflex action takes a lot less time to perform than it did for me to type it. In fact, the average rider could perform this action in about one second. Impressive, huh. But, here's the problem. That whole reaction thing took about a second, and during that time you traveled 66 feet at 60 m.p.h. This is before your brakes ever engaged or your RPM'S slowed. That is a considerable amount of highway used up, and this is if you are up to par with your reaction time. And many things can slow that time.

Speeding up your reaction time really isn't an option. It is almost impossible to speed up your reflex actions. However, the solution is really quite simple. Drive in such a manner that you are not having to react to split-second situations. If you keep a longer following distance from the vehicle ahead you will have plenty of time to react and that one-second reaction time is no longer a factor.

How much following space do you need to be safe? That is determined by many factors. Your speed, traffic volume, and weather all play a big part of that equation. But, you must also take your equipment into account. Are your tires good? Are your brakes working properly or are they a bit worn. Is your suspension working, as it should? But, the biggest factor is you.

Are your reflexes up to the one-second average? Are you a little under par? Many things affect this reaction time. Your eyes are they seeing clearly. Or are they a little cloudy for some reason. Your brain needs to be working clearly and decisively. Many things affect this: Stress, Distractions, Illness, and some Medications. Even your posture on the bike dictates how quickly your muscles react to the stimulus from your brain.

I feel certain that very few of us ride at 100 % of our abilities 100% of the time. But, we need to recognize when we are coming up short and factor that into our riding style or distance for the day. If you will allow for this in your following distances you may have "Just the few more feet" you needed to avoid an accident.

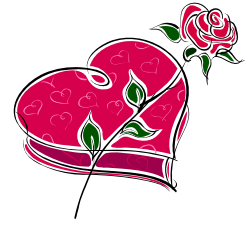

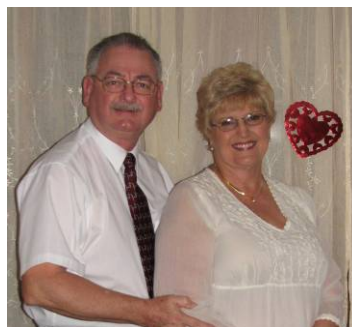
We sure missed a lot of you at this fun event and hope to see you soon. Thanks to all who did show up. Events like these are only fun because of the participation of each one of you.

Parking Lot Practice

I would like to thank Jeff Ingram and Paul Duke, MSF Instructors at American Motorcycle Training for hosting our Chapter at their range located at 8233 Will Clayton Parkway in Humble.

Jeff and Paul were very gracious at assisting us at our first annual Parking Lot Practice. As this was a warm-up for our upcoming ERC provided by American Motorcycle Training this practice session was very beneficial. We were only able to practice a limited number of maneuvers due to time constraints. But of course the old dreaded “Box” was one of these exercises.

I feel that the remedial training on these ranges should be approached with an open mind towards learning what your weakness may be. The instructors were very helpful with constructive insight as to what each rider did right and wrong. While everyone feels his or her riding is above reproach, I have to ask, is it really? If you have not taken a course lately ask yourself why. I sometimes think the reason may be a lack of confidence on the part of the rider. If so, getting through the course will give you a big confidence boost. On the other hand, if your confidence convinces you that your riding skills are fine with out remedial training I challenge you to try it. The results may be a little humbling.

Personally, I went into the PLP Sunday with a little apprehension about my weaving and obstacle avoidance skills, although the latter skill got a real time test in December. I trusted my reflexes and braking abilities. Turns out I did well with these exercises. But, a weakness that surprised me showed up. Seems my weaving and avoidance skills, or lack of, may actually be a throttle control issue. Paul was very supportive and helpful, suggesting I change my hand position on the grips. Paul also hinted that it might be beneficial to raise my handlebars. I already have a small riser on my handlebars, but maybe I need a little more. Now that I have been made aware of the throttle issue, I may be able to overcome it without further adaptation of the bars.

I guess we will know the answer to that question after our ERC on Sunday March 2nd. We will convene at the range at 1:00 to get registered and briefed. The course must start at 1:30 sharp to insure that all exercises are completed by dark. Again, I would like to thank Jeff and Paul for their time, patience, and wisdom. Watch for next month’s newsletter to see if I conquer my demon, the old throttle control monster. Until next month as always
