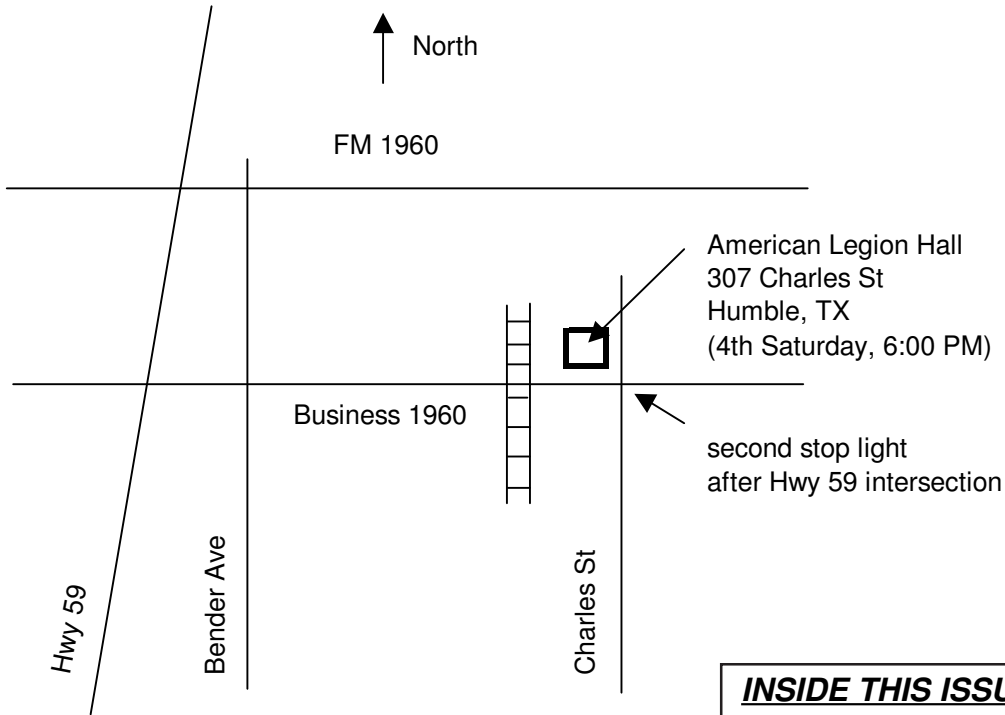

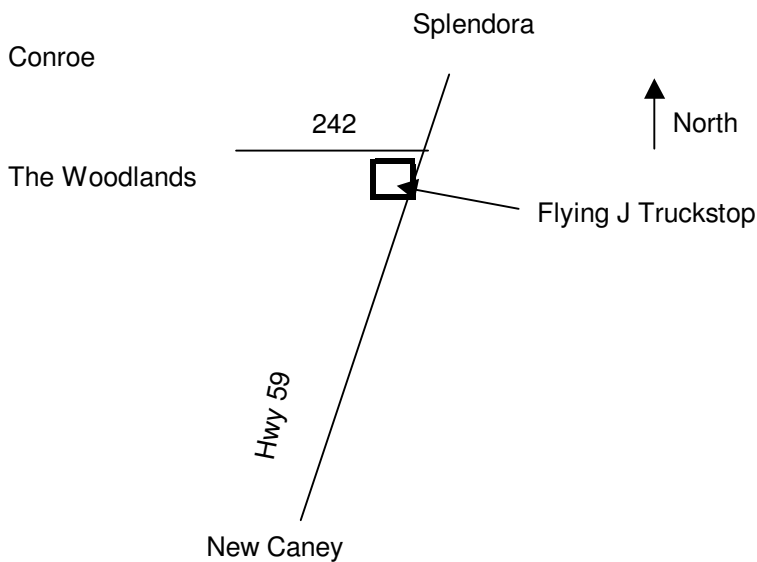

EMERGENCY INFORMATION

It has been so hot this summer that no one has wanted to get out on long trips. But all that is hopefully going to change soon. With the cooler weather coming, the riding season will be getting busier. Any time you take a trip, whether it is long or short, you should always have emergency contact information and medical information about yourself and your rider on your motorcycle. It is also a good idea to share the information with other people in your group. Heaven forbid that something might happen to you, but at least someone will know details about your medical history and family or will, at least, know where to look.

The type of information you should have written down is any family contacts that would not be on the trip with you and their address and telephone numbers, both work and home. You should also have your doctor's name and phone number along with your health insurance information. You should include a list of the names of your medications you are taking along with the milligram and dosage. List if you wear contacts, false teeth, hearing aids, or a pacemaker. All this information is helpful, if you ever need medical attention and cannot speak for yourself. You should include any allergies you have in the medical information also (i.e., medicines, food, or insects). A short list of any past medical problems would also be helpful in an

emergency situation. Little things you may not think of might provide crucial information for the medical caregiver. The more emergency information you provide, the better care someone can get for you, if need be.

GWRRRA has a great Emergency Information Form that you can use as a helpful tool to gather the information that could, in fact, some day save your life (*referenced on page 8*). After you have the information, you can get it laminated or even just fold it up and put into a watertight zip-lock bag. A label should be made with I.C.E. (*in case of emergency*) on the bag where it will be visible. A lot of riders put it in the left front pocket or in a saddlebag. Some people also have all this info in their wallet or purse. There are a few members in our chapter that have the little water resistant envelopes that stick on to their helmet. They have filled it out, in case of an emergency card, and it stores safely inside. If you ask Steve and Linda Seligman about these, they can help you get one for yourself. The bottom line is we need to be as prepared as we can, because we never know when we might need help. So before we start our fall and winter riding season, lets all get the correct information and fill out an Emergency Information Sheet and put it in our bikes. And remember, when people deserve your love and support the least that is when they need it the most.

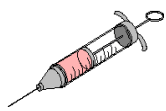

Cheesy Shrimp Bites



Ingredients

- 6 English muffins
- one 5-oz. jar English cheese spread
- 1/4 c. margarine
- 1 T. mayonnaise
- 1/2 tsp. seasoned salt
- 1/2 tsp. garlic powder
- 1/4 tsp. lemon pepper
- one 12-oz. bag frozen shrimp, thawed

Directions

Drain shrimp and pat dry with paper towel. Mix cheese, margarine, mayonnaise, and seasonings. Stir in half of the shrimp. Spread on muffin halves and freeze on a baking sheet. Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Cut each muffin half into 6 wedges. Bake for 5-8 minutes. Garnish tops with remaining shrimp and place under broiler. Broil until bubbly and golden brown.

Goat Cheese and Tomato Spread



Ingredients

- 4 cloves garlic, unpeeled
- 4 oz. goat cheese
- 1 c. plum tomatoes, peeled, seeded, and diced
- 1/2 c. red onion, diced
- 1/4 c. olive oil
- 6 T. balsamic vinegar
- 3 T. fresh basil, chopped

Directions

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Wrap garlic in foil and bake 15 minutes until soft. Squeeze garlic from skin and mash with fork. Beat garlic and cheese until smooth. Shape cheese mixture into mound in a microwave-safe dish. In a bowl, toss together tomatoes, onion, basil, oil, and vinegar. To serve, warm cheese in the microwave. Place warmed cheese in the center of a serving platter and spoon the tomato mixture over the goat cheese. Serve with toast points or crackers.

Baked Spinach Balls

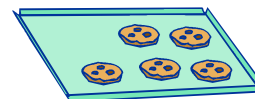
Ingredients

- 1 10 oz. pkg. frozen chopped spinach
- 3 eggs, lightly beaten
- 1 1/2 c. Pepperidge Farm Herb Bread Crumbs (stuffing mix)
- 1/2 c. Parmesan cheese
- 1/3 c. melted butter

Directions

Cook spinach as directed on package; drain well. In large bowl, mix together all ingredients. Form into balls and freeze. Bake at 350 degrees for 10 minutes or until lightly brown.

Zucchini Crab Cakes



Ingredients

- 1 egg
- 1 1/2 tsp. Old Bay seasoning
- 1 T. onion flakes
- 2 T. melted butter
- 2 1/2 c. grated peeled zucchini
- 1 c. plain breadcrumbs
- 1/2 c. flour
- Oil for frying

Directions

Combine egg, seasoning, onion flakes, butter, and zucchini. Stir in breadcrumbs. Shape into cakes and roll in flour. Fry in oil until golden brown on both sides. Serve with cocktail sauce or tartar sauce if you like.

**There is no real crab in this recipe. All the ingredients mixed together taste like crab.*

Won Tons



Ingredients

- 1 lb. won ton skins or 1 lb. egg roll sheets, cut in quarters

Filling:

- 1/2 lb. ground beef
- 1/2 lb. ground pork
- 1 8 oz. water chestnut, chopped fine
- 3 stalks green onion, chopped fine
- 2 tsp. sesame seed oil
- Salt and pepper to taste

Directions

Mix filling ingredients together. Place about one teaspoon of filling in center of won ton skin and fold over, making a triangle, sealing edges by wetting with water. Deep fry in hot oil until golden and meat is cooked (about 5 minutes). Serve with catsup mixed with Coleman dry mustard or with sweet and sour sauce. Yield: 12 servings

Baked Crab Dip



Ingredients

- 1 8 oz. pkg. cream cheese, softened
- 1 6 oz. can crabmeat
- 2 Tbs. grated onion
- 1 Tbs. milk
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1/4 tsp. pepper
- 1/4 tsp. Worcestershire sauce
- 1 Tbs. finely sliced green onions, for garnish

Directions

In a medium bowl, combine cream cheese, crabmeat, onion, milk, salt, pepper, and Worcestershire sauce. Stir well. Place mixture in an ovenproof serving dish; sprinkle with a little paprika. Bake at 375 degrees for about 15 minutes or until thoroughly heated. Sprinkle with sliced green onion. Yield: approximately 2 cups
